### The Abbe Museum

■ Visit the Abbe Museum at two locations: the new museum in downtown Bar Harbor and the original Abbe at Sieur de Monts Spring in Acadia National Park. The new museum has spacious galleries for exhibitions, a hands-on Learning Laboratory and areas for indoor and outdoor programs. The permanent exhibition Wabanaki: People of the Dawn will introduce you to contemporary Native Americans in Maine. Changing and traveling exhibitions will engage you in exciting explorations of Maine's Native American heritage and archaeology. Check the schedule for workshops and demonstrations by Native Americans, performances, archaeology field schools, lectures and hands-on programs for children.

### Lake Champlain Museum at Basin Harbor

### Strawbery Banke

■ The place that is today called Strawbery Banke has a long and rich history, stretching back three and a half centuries to the earliest years of English settlement in New England. Strawbery Banke, the museum, is dedicated to the study of the lives of these people and others who left their mark on Portsmouth's history. Of the many historic buildings on the site, the Jones House now serves as Strawbery Banke's Archaeology Center, containing must-see archaeological exhibits and laboratories.

■ Come experience Maine, the way life was. The museum's 12,000 Years in Maine exhibit focuses on the state's archeology and prehistoric life. The exhibit includes a Paleo-Indian meat cache, an archaeological dig reconstruction, and over two thousand artifacts and specimens dating from the end of the Ice Age through the 1800s.
