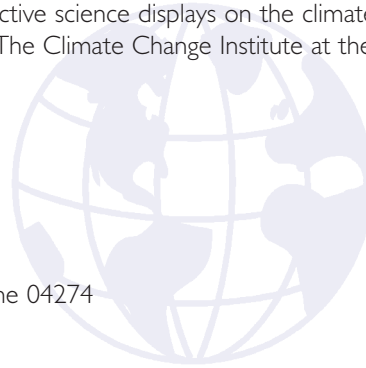
Poland Spring Preservation Park
