Marine Resources Aquarium

■ Children of all ages will enjoy a hands-on experience of Maine's marine life at the Marine Resources Aquarium. Exhibits include live salmon, smelts, striped bass, a mini mussel farm, and other marine specimens. Be sure to visit "Louie," a 17- pound live lobster estimated to be 14 years old. Touch a live shark, horseshoe crab, sea cucumber, or many varieties of shellfish including lobster that are housed in the touch tanks.

Lobstering at the Children's Museum of Portsmouth

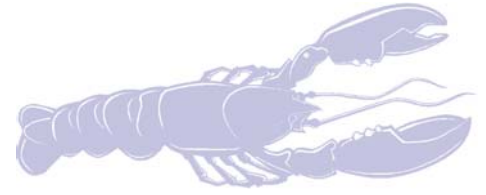
