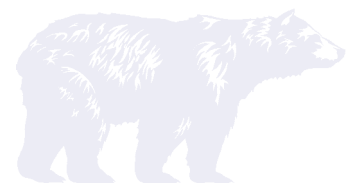

Over the River and Through the Woods

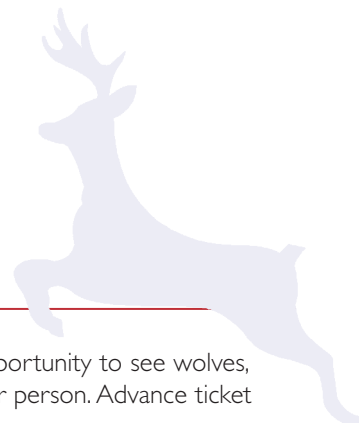
